The school day

- We start the day by lining up with our tutor group (and the rest of the year group) on the Lower Hard Play.

Uniform

- White long or short sleeved shirt
- Bradon Forest School Tie
- Black V-necked school jumper with BFS logo or cardigan with BFS logo
- Black Blazer with BFS logo
- Black Trousers/skirt/tailored shorts
- Black school shoes, flat or low heeled, no logos.

Uniform

- **Coats & Jackets**: Suitable school coat. No Denim, tracksuit or hooded tops.
- Jewellery: Watches may be worn. One pair of small sleepers or studs may also be worn, with one sleeper or stud per earlobe only.
- Hair & Make-Up : Hair should be of reasonable length and style. There should be no extremes of colour. Make-Up of any type, acrylic nails, colourful nail varnish and false eye lashes are not permitted.







Equipment
